Cardinals don't migrate. They stick around during the winter and are common visitors to backyards and feeders, especially those with a great supply of food. They can gather in big flocks of about 70 birds during winter time and often nest in bushy thickets.

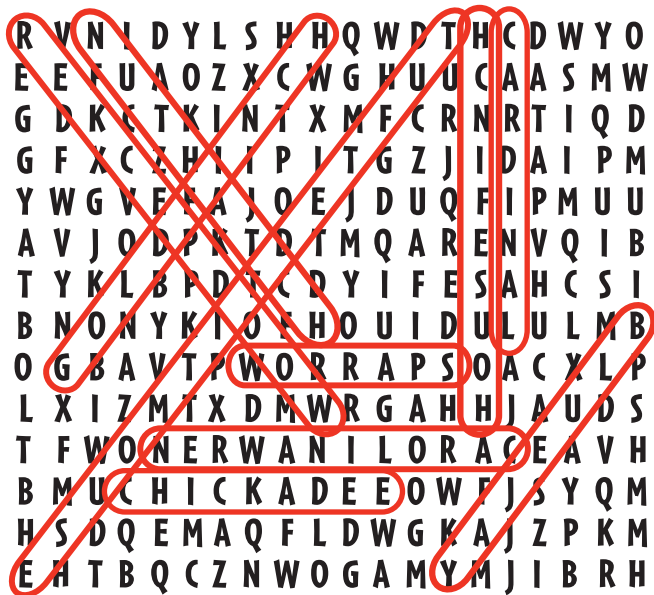

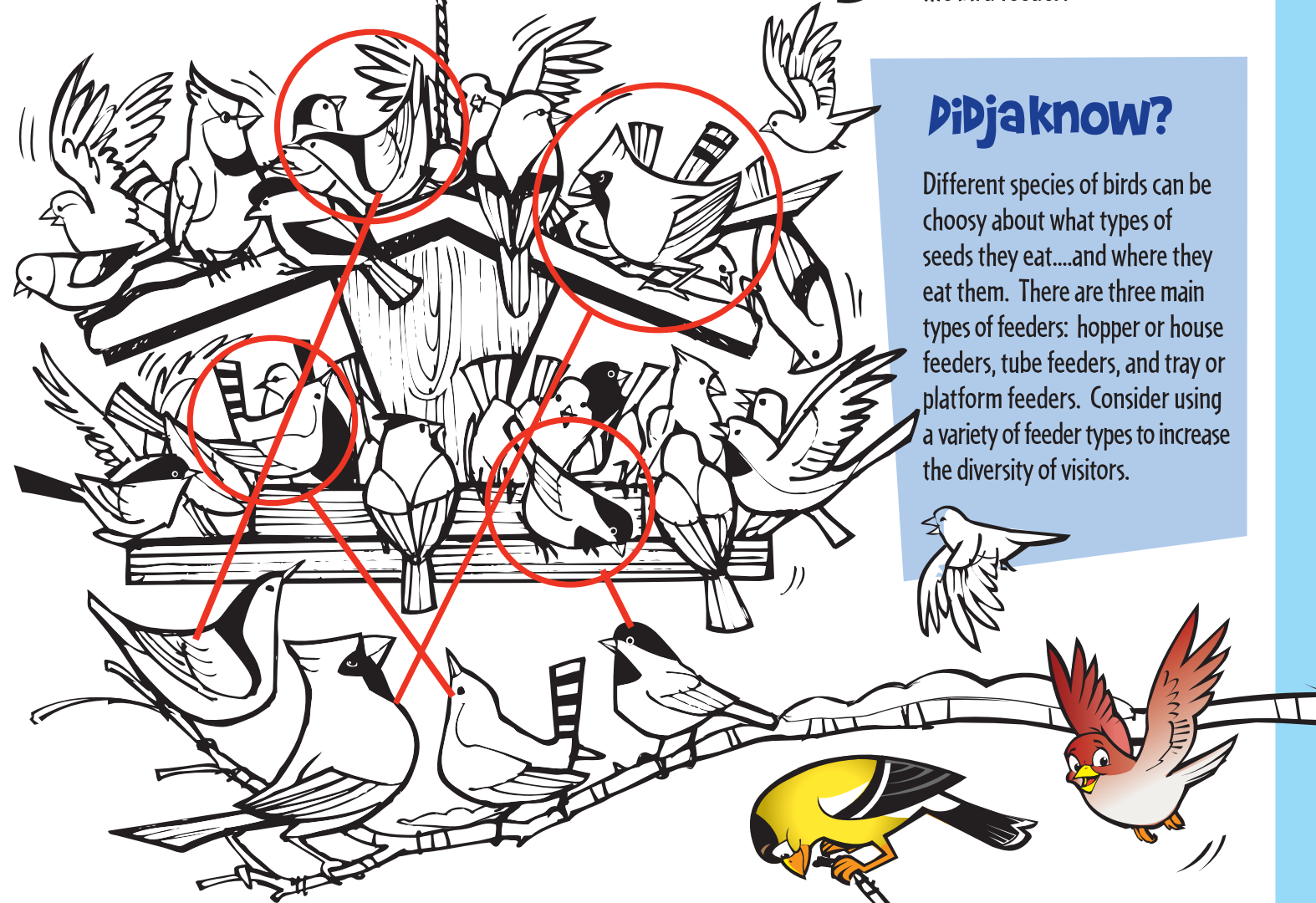

Can you match the four birds on the branch with the birds around the bird feeder?

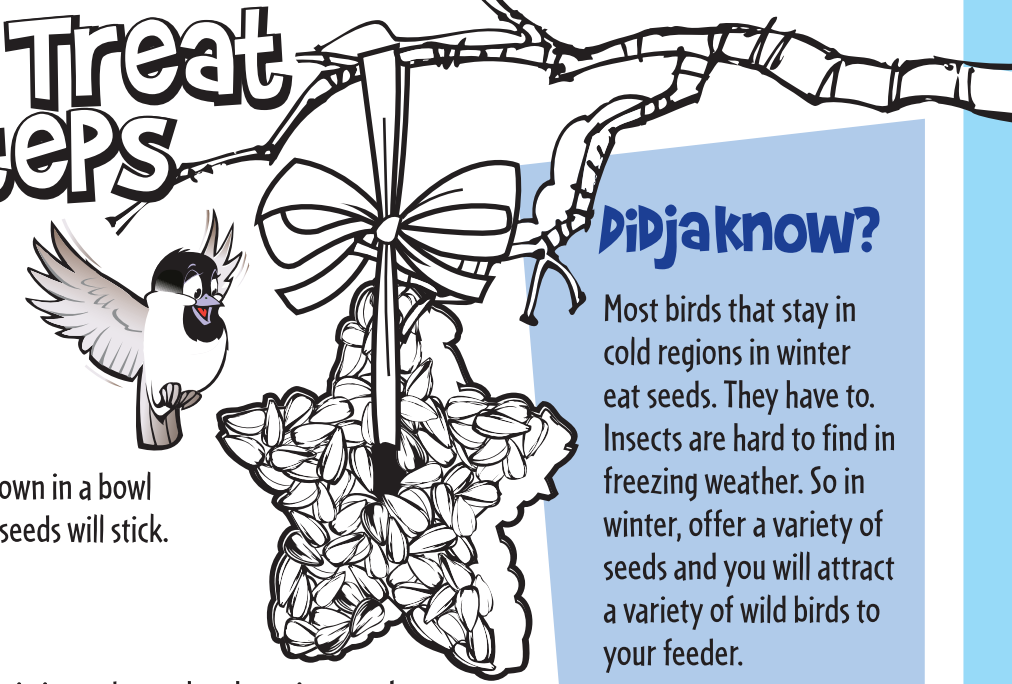


Didjknow?

Different species of birds can be choosy about what types of seeds they eat...and where they eat them. There are three main types of feeders: hopper or house feeders, tube feeders, and tray or platform feeders. Consider using a variety of feeder types to increase the diversity of visitors.

Make a Bird Treat in 5 Easy Steps

- 1 Take a cookie cutter and cut a shape out of a slice of bread. Use a pencil to poke a small hole near center.
- 2 Toast and let sit out for a day to get stale.
- 3 Put peanut butter on one side and place down in a bowl of sunflower seeds, pressing lightly so the seeds will stick.
- 4 Do the other side.
- 5 Put a piece of ribbon through the hole and tie into a bow...then hang in a tree!



Didjknow?

Most birds that stay in cold regions in winter eat seeds. They have to. Insects are hard to find in freezing weather. So in winter, offer a variety of seeds and you will attract a variety of wild birds to your feeder.
